

The <u>Cleveland HeartLab</u> found that dog owners are more likely than their non-dog owning counterparts to have lower blood pressure. Dog owners tend to walk more, as we're motivated by those puppy dog

eyes staring up at us begging to get out there and take to the trails. This increased physical activity keeps dog owner hearts stronger and less likely to experience disease.

In addition to increased physical fitness, studies compiled in an <u>AHA</u> <u>Journal meta-analysis</u> found that owning a dog reduces a person's feelings of loneliness and social isolation. The companionship and loyalty we get from our dogs keeps us feeling connected and less stressed, which in turn lowers the risk of cardiovascular diseases.

Spending time with your canine companion can have you feeling physically stronger, more connected to the world around you, and more at ease. My conclusion? Everyone's resolution this year should be even MORE dogs!


